



June Emergency Responses












- ♦ Fire Alarm False alarms (due to monsoon)






Significant calls



- ♦ June 1: Land fill Fire, multi agency response. Rio Rico, Nogales, Tubac, and County assets. Responded to the Rio Rico Land Fill, units on duty investigated smoke in the area and found county employees attempting to extinguish a deep seated fire. Tubac units requested mutual aid response from Rio Rico Fire and Nogales Fire.
- ♦ June 17: Reported brush fire was actually a vehicle rollover with one fatality. Units responded in Fire apparatus and were later notified the incident was not a brush fire and was a vehicle rollover with one person trapped inside. Delayed response of appropriate units.
- ♦ June 23: Major arterial bleed of the arm, patient's arm came in contact with blades from a drone. Tubac units responded along with Santa Cruz County deputies. Tubac medics arrived on scene to find deputies applying tourniquet to the affected limb. Patient was transported by ground lights and sirens; no air ambulance available due to inclement weather.



Training

Tubac Fire Hosted the regional Academy, on duty crews assisted with all training. Cadets trained on:

- Hose deployment
- Hose management
- Ladder operations
- Setting up Master streams
- and Conducted Live burns





- Medical Team to the Pipeline Fire in Flagstaff 1039 and Polaris. Paramedic Zamora/EMT Mills out twelve days.
- Medical Team Contreras Fire Unit 1038 with EMT Mohinea. Kitt Peak observatory, Out one week.


















Congratulations To Hesly Guerrero
